A Ski Tournament is a day of special activities which includes a Terrain Park Relay, a Mad Dash (an individual sprint race - the event in which Chandra Crawford won her 2006 Olympic gold medal! and a variety of games. The objective of the event is to encourage participation, teamwork and good technique.

TEAM SPRINTS

A team sprint is a two-person sprint relay. The first skiers on each team start together and race the sprint course, then hand off to their team-mates, who also ski the course. The second skiers then hand-off to the first skiers who ski the course again, and so on. This is the event in which Devon Kershaw and Alex Harvey won gold at the 2011 World Championships.







CCC OFFICIALS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

This program consists of five steps from entry level through to international level. It includes technical delegate, event management and course conductor training as well as standard training for officials.

Level 1

An eight hour course that provides an overview of what a cross country ski competition is all about. The focus is on the duties of minor officials for both 'Olympic' style (interval start, mass start, pursuit start, individual sprint, team sprint and relay) and 'Loppet' style (mass participation) competitions.

Course fee for CCBC members: \$85.00 Course fee for non-members: \$160.00

Level 2

A 16 hour course that prepares officials for leadership roles on a competition committee at club, provincial and most national level races, including the BC Cup Series, BC Winter Games and loppets. The course covers all official race formats, rules and regulations, rule interpretation, electronic timing, all aspects of the results system and volunteer management.

Course fee for CCBC members: \$100.00 Course fee for non-members: \$200.00

Level 3

This is a 3.5 day course. It is designed to prepare an official to (1) effectively structure, staff and manage a competition committee at provincial through national level competitions, (2) perform any 'major' official role at the National Championship level, (3) perform the role of a provincial Technical Delegate at a provincial and national level races and (4) have a good understanding of NC/FIS rules.

Please note the requirements for participation in Officials Certification Courses - levels 1 & 2. Course pre-requisites will be strictly enforced. For more information about course pre-requisites visit the CCBC website at: http://www.crosscountrybc.ca/officials-development

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of Cross Country BC:

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Association's financial reporting process.



Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements. As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit
 procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of
 expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Association's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.



Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

As required by the *Societies Act* (British Columbia), we report that, in our opinion, the accounting principles in Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations have been applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended March 31, 2023

Cross Country BC (the "Association") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of British Columbia and accordingly is exempt from income tax under provisions of the Income Tax Act provided certain requirements of the Income Tax Act are met. It is not a registered charity that can issue tax receipts. Its purpose is to provide provincial programming for the continuous development of cross-country skiing programs, recreational through to competitive, to a broad cross section of the community.

1. Significant accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations and include the following significant accounting policies:

Short-term investments

Short-term investments consist of investments in money market or other short-term instruments with a maturity of more than 90 days and less than one year.

Property and equipment

Property and equipment are carried at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is calculated annually as follows:

Timing equipment	25%
Treadmill	25%

Contributed property and equipment are recorded at fair values at the date of the contribution.

Property and equipment are tested for recoverability whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that their carrying amounts may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized when the carrying amount of an asset is not recoverable and exceeds its fair value or replacement cost. Write-downs are not reversed.

Revenue recognition

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions, which include donations and government grants. Revenue is recorded when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Government grants approved but not received at the end of an accounting period are accrued. Restricted contributions are recognized in revenue in the period in which the expenses relating to the project are incurred.

Restricted contributions received for the acquisition of property and equipment are deferred and amortized to revenue on the same basis that the related property and equipment are amortized.

Revenue from memberships and programs are recognized when the services are provided or the goods are sold. Sponsorships, marketing and other revenue are recognized when the services or goods are provided.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Contributed materials and services

Contributed materials and services are not recognized in the financial statements unless they are substantial, a fair value can be reasonably estimated and the materials and services are used in the normal course of operations and would otherwise have been purchased. No contributed materials and services were recognized in the years ending 2023 and 2022.

Financial Instruments

Arm's Length Transactions

Measurement of financial instruments

The Association measures its financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value at the acquisition date, except for financial assets and financial liabilities acquired in related party transactions.

The Association subsequently measures all of its financial assets and financial liabilities at amortized cost.

Related Party Transactions

Measurement of related party financial instruments

The Association measures all related party financial instruments recognized in these financial statements at either the cost of the related party financial instrument, or at the cost of the consideration exchanged for the related party financial instrument. Measurement is based on the nature of the financial instrument, and depends on whether the instrument has repayment terms. The Association has no related party financial instruments required to be measured at fair value.

When the instrument has repayment terms, the cost is determined using the undiscounted cash flows, excluding interest and dividend payments, and less any impairment losses previously recognized by the transferor.

When the related party financial instrument has no repayment terms, the cost of the instrument is determined using the consideration transferred or received.

Related party financial instruments initially measured at cost are subsequently measured using the cost method.

<u>Transaction Costs</u>

Transaction costs related to the acquisition or issuance of financial instruments subsequently measured at fair value and to instruments originated or exchanged in a related party transaction are recognized in excess of revenues over expenditures when incurred. The carrying amounts of financial instruments not subsequently measured at fair value are adjusted by the amount of the transaction costs directly attributable to the acquisition or issuance of the instrument, and the adjustment is recognized in excess of revenues over expenditures over the life of the instrument using the straight-line method.

1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Financial Instruments (continued)

Impairment

Financial assets measured at amortized cost and related party financial assets measured using the cost method are assessed for indications of impairment at the end of each reporting period. If impairment is identified, the amount of the write-down is recognized as an impairment loss in excess of revenues over expenditures. Previously recognized impairment losses are reversed when the extent of the impairment decreases, provided that the adjusted carrying amount is no greater than the amount that would have been reported at the date of the reversal had the impairment not been recognized previously. The amount of the reversal is recognized in the excess of revenues over expenditures.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenditures during the reporting period.

The Guaranteed Investment Certificates are held with the Royal Bank of Canada, earn interest at 4.3% (2022: 0.8%) per annum and mature in September, 2023 (2022: March, 2023).

Restricted cash

Revenue earned from the Community Gaming Grant is used to purchase goods and services required to provide the various programs offered by the Association during the year.

Funds held in the Association's gaming account are restricted for these future programs, and have therefore been classified as restricted cash. The balance in this account at March 31, 2023 is \$544 (2022: \$544).

Additionally, the Association received \$65,000 restricted for future program and development expenditures (Note 6). The balance held at March 31, 2023 is \$65,000 (2022: \$Nil).

8. Financial instruments

Items that meet the definition of a financial instrument include cash, restricted cash, short-term investment, accounts receivable and payables and accruals.

Financial instrument transactions, such as purchasing and selling investments, collecting receivables and settling payables may result in exposure to significant financial risks and concentrations of risk. For the year ended March 31, 2023, the Association was not exposed to significant risks arising from its financial instruments. There have been no changes to the significant risks from the prior year.

9. Economic dependence

A significant portion of the Association's revenues are derived from direct and indirect funding from the Province of British Columbia. In 2023, these revenues represented 36% (2022: 35%) of total revenues.

10. Remuneration of employees, contractors and directors

The Societies Act of British Columbia requires the Association to disclose the remuneration paid to employees and contractors whose remuneration during the year was at least \$75,000 and all remuneration paid to directors.

For the fiscal year ended 2023, included in expenditures is a total of \$82,800 paid to one employee (2022: \$82,800).

No directors of the Association were remunerated for the fiscal year ending 2023 (2022: none).
